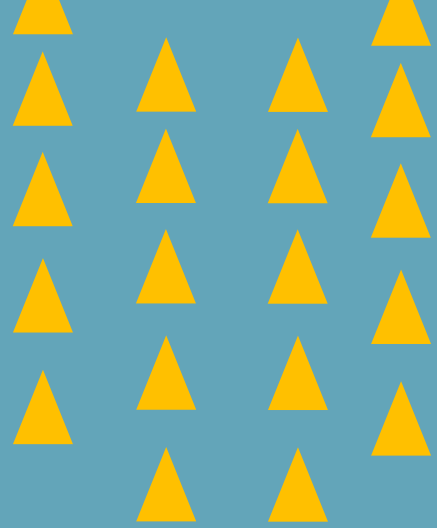

# The Operational Program “Eastern Macedonia and Thrace 2021–2027” and its Development Strategy

## The Operational Program "Eastern Macedonia and Thrace" 2021-2027

is a key instrument for implementing the development strategy of the Region of Eastern Macedonia and Thrace within the framework of the NSRF 2021–2027. It draws funding from: the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF), the European Social Fund Plus (ESF+). It operates in complementarity and synergy with sectoral programs and other financial instruments.

The Program was designed gradually, in accordance with the circulars of the Ministry of Development and Investments regarding the planning of the 2021–2027 Programs and the submission of draft plans to the European Commission.

In the preparation of the Program, the following were taken into account:

- The guidelines and documents of the EU Cohesion Policy
- The principles of the European Pillar of Social Rights
- The Recommendations of the Council of the European Union
- The country-specific Recommendations of the European Semester
- All complementary policies
- National and regional development tools
- The results of the consultation process

The **total budget** of the Program amounts to **€639,098,846** in public expenditure, of which **€473,526,740** comes from the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) and **€165,572,106** from the European Social Fund Plus (ESF+). The **national contribution** amounts to 15%, corresponding to **€95,864,829**, while the remaining 85% concerns **EU contribution**, amounting to **€543,234,017**.

The objective of the Program is to effectively address the problems created by the 2009 economic crisis, which were further intensified by the COVID-19 health crisis, causing multiple and significant impacts on the economy, employment, social cohesion, and health.

The **strategic objectives** of the Program are:

- supporting and restarting the economy;
- protecting and utilizing the rich natural environment and cultural resources;
- upgrading human capital and strengthening social cohesion.

Through these objectives, the Program seeks to improve the Region's economic, social, and environmental indicators, reducing the gap between its performance and that of other Greek Regions, as well as the EU average.

**Priorities:** The completion of critical infrastructure that connects the Region of Eastern Macedonia and Thrace with national and international transport, energy, and telecommunications networks, strengthening its geostrategic position while creating a favorable and competitive environment capable of attracting human capital, investments, and visitors, thereby contributing to the region's development.

### A Value Hub

Through the strengthening and expansion of the productive base by investing in R&I, primarily in sectors identified by the Smart Specialisation Strategy.



**Priorities:** 1) Shaping a sustainable production model based on: tourism, culture, the environment, and agri-food. 2) Investing in clean forms of energy, transitioning to the circular economy, and promoting green and blue entrepreneurship.

## A Model of Social Intervention

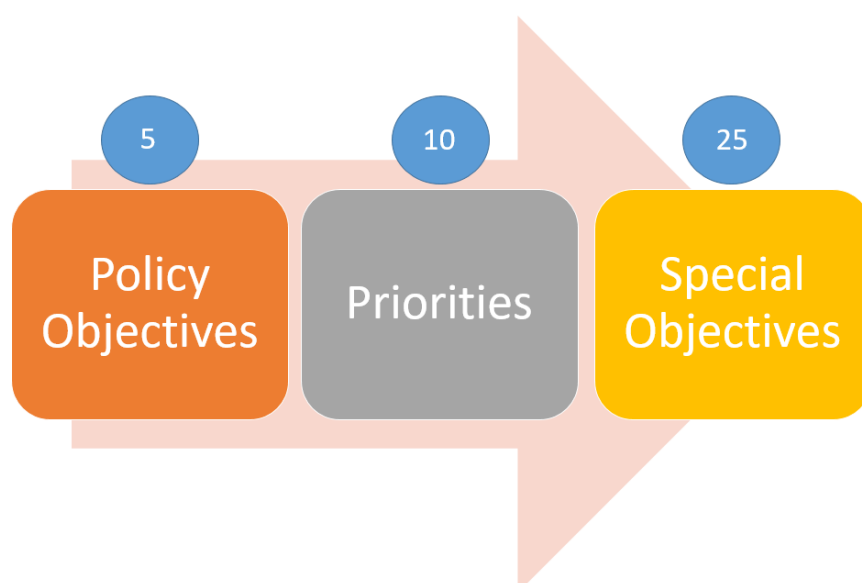
Through initiatives that strengthen employment in sectors, areas, and population groups facing particular disadvantages or specific challenges.

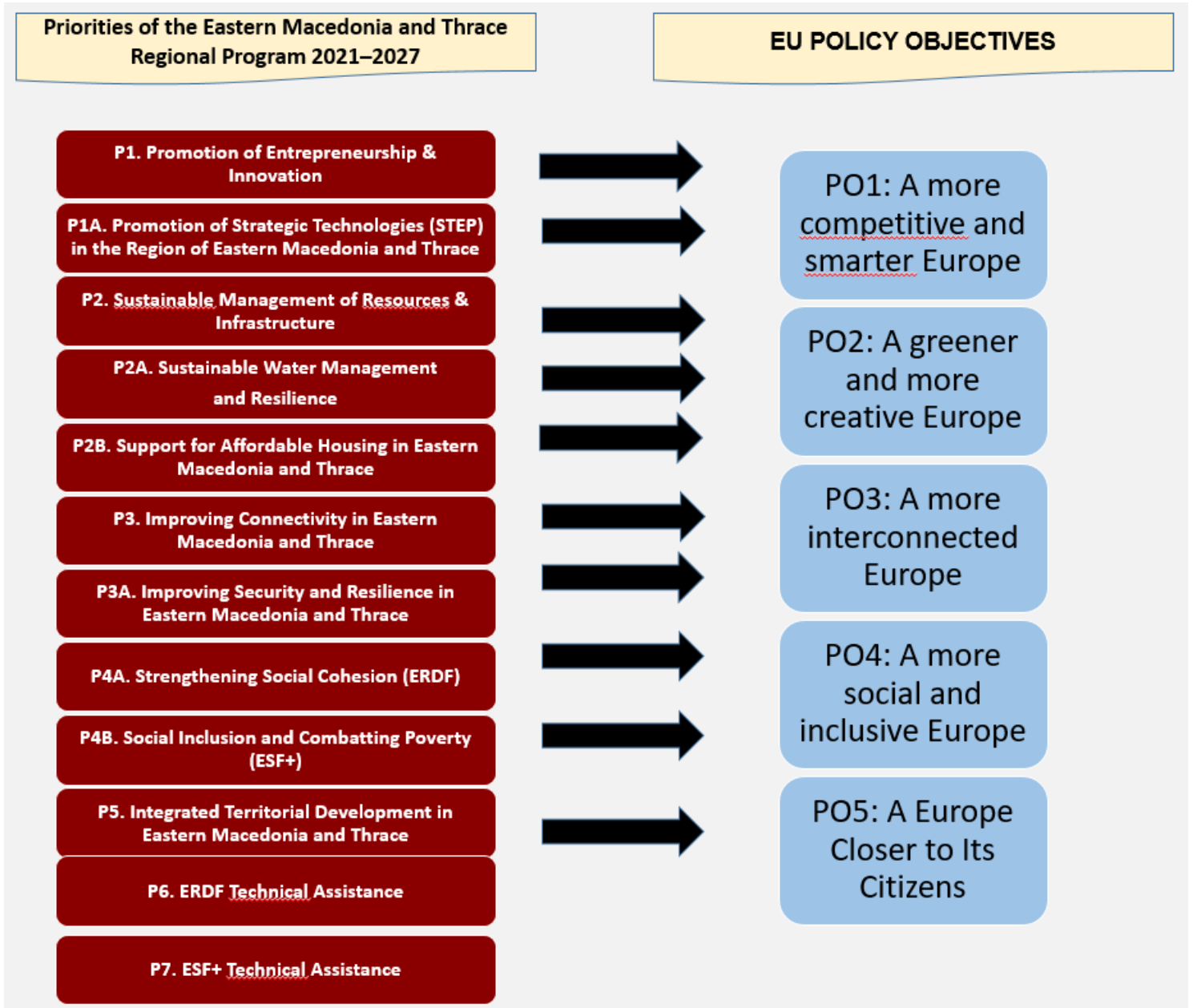
- Upgrading human resources in research, innovation, and digital skills.

# Program Structure by Policy Objective (PO) and Priority

## PO1: A more competitive and smarter Europe

---

### Strategic Directions of the Program under PO1

- Redefining the production model, with emphasis on innovative products and services in RIS3 priority sectors.
- Improving the business environment by supporting and empowering SMEs.
- Supporting and strengthening research infrastructure.
- Strengthening research and linking it with production, especially in sectors where Eastern Macedonia and Thrace has advantages, and promoting partnerships between research institutions and businesses.
- Developing 5G network infrastructure, primarily in areas of business activity, and expanding broadband coverage in mountainous and rural areas to reduce intra-regional inequalities and end the isolation of remote areas.
- Expanding and strengthening public digital services for residents, businesses, and visitors.
- Supporting SMEs as well as large enterprises in implementing investments that contribute to the development or production of critical technologies in the EU, or to securing and strengthening the corresponding value chains in STEP sectors.

### Promotion of Entrepreneurship & Innovation

Budget: €48,875,893

#### Specific objective

**1i** Development and strengthening of research and innovation capacities and use of advanced technologies.

Budget: €8,000,000

**1ii** Strengthening the sustainable growth and competitiveness of SMEs and creating jobs in SMEs, including through productive investments.

Budget: €40,875,893

#### Indicative Actions

- Support for businesses to improve their performance in research, development, and innovation, as well as their cooperation with research and academic institutions.
- Support for existing businesses and the establishment of new businesses, primarily in RIS3 strategy sectors.
- Development and upgrading of business support mechanisms and structures.
- Support for existing manufacturing enterprises in the Region of Eastern Macedonia and Thrace to improve their energy efficiency.

## PO1: A more competitive and smarter Europe

### Priority 1A

## Promotion of Strategic Technologies (STEP) in the Region of Eastern Macedonia and Thrace

Budget: €8,000,000

#### Specific objective

**1Ai** Support for investments contributing to the objectives of the Strategic Technologies for Europe Platform (STEP), as referred to in Article 2 of Regulation (EU) 2024/795 of the European Parliament and of the Council.

Budget: €8,000,000

#### Indicative Actions

- Digital technologies: Support for businesses to develop cutting-edge technologies such as: advanced semiconductor technologies, artificial intelligence technologies, advanced connectivity, navigation, and digital technologies.
- Clean and resource-efficient technologies: Support for businesses to develop clean and resource-efficient technologies focused on resource optimization, sustainability, recycling, reuse, and the promotion of net-zero emissions, such as: onshore wind energy technologies and offshore renewable energy technologies.
- Biotechnologies: Support for businesses to develop biotechnologies, for example in agri-food, sustainable agriculture, circular bioeconomy, green chemistry, and biomanufacturing.
- Related services that are specifically and critically important for the development and production of final products under the main STEP pillars.

## PO2: A greener and more creative Europe

### Strategic Program Directions under PO2

- Utilizing existing renewable energy potential, especially geothermal energy, and reducing dependence on conventional energy sources.
- Saving energy in buildings and public spaces.
- Promoting rational and sustainable management and resilience of water resources, while ensuring sufficient quantity and quality of drinking water.
- Improving resource efficiency and promoting integrated solid and liquid waste management.
- Preserving, protecting, and promoting the natural and man-made environment.

**Budget: €137,018,926**

#### **Specific objective**

**2i** Promoting energy efficiency measures and reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

**Budget: €35,000,000**

**2ii** Development of smart energy systems, networks, and storage equipment outside the TEN-E network.

**Budget: €14,000,000**

**2iii** Promoting climate change adaptation, disaster risk prevention, and resilience, taking into account ecosystem-based approaches.

**Budget: €29,000,000**

**2iv.** Promoting safe access to water, sustainable water management, including integrated water management, and water resilience.

**Budget: €54,018,926**

#### **Indicative Actions**

- Energy-saving actions in public and municipal buildings under regional and local responsibility, in sectors such as health, education, sports, culture, public administration, and local government.
- Expansion of natural gas use in households and businesses / construction of natural gas distribution networks.
- Construction of flood protection works, including green infrastructure.
- Strengthening civil protection infrastructure for the prevention and management of climate-related risks.
- Interventions to protect coasts and soils from erosion.
- Construction and/or upgrading of water infrastructure.
- Upgrading water supply networks and reducing leakages through remote monitoring and remote-control systems.
- River Basin Management Plans, Marine Strategy actions, and completion of Maritime Spatial Planning Frameworks. Plans and interventions to ensure access to quality drinking water resources, including Master Plans, Water Safety Plans, and bathing coasts.
- Development of a monitoring network for surface and groundwater.

**2v.** Promoting the transition to a circular and resource-efficient economy.

**Budget: €5,000,000**

- Actions in solid waste management, such as:
  - Green points and recycling corners
  - Equipment for source separation, collection and transport of bio-waste, and small-scale composting units.
  - Equipment for collection and transport of green waste and standardization of pre-treatment material, including shredding and baling.

## **Priority 2A**

### **Sustainable Water Management and Resilience**

**Budget – €23.000.000**

#### **Specific objective**

**2Ai** Promoting safe access to water, sustainable water management, including integrated water management, and water resilience.

**Budget: €23,000,000**

#### **Indicative Actions**

- Expansion and upgrading of water supply network infrastructure.
- Modernization of water supply networks using new technologies.
- Implementation of systems to protect aquatic ecosystems and restore areas of high environmental value, such as Natura 2000 areas.
- Sustainable water desalination

## **Priority 2B**

# **Support for Affordable Housing in Eastern Macedonia and Thrace**

**Budget - €10.000.000**

### **Specific objective**

**2Bi** Promoting access to affordable and sustainable housing.

**Budget: €10,000,000**

### **Indicative Actions**

- Renovation of old housing through mild energy interventions.
- Renovation of municipal and regional buildings.

## PO3: A more interconnected Europe

---

### Strategic Program Directions under PO3

- Integration into wider international transport networks through the continuation of the construction of the Trans-European road network.
- Improvement of the intra-regional road network and strengthening accessibility in remote areas.
- Strengthening safe and fast movement of residents, visitors, and goods.
- Strengthening coastal shipping and improving port infrastructure.
- Improving security and protection of Eastern Macedonia and Thrace through the development of resilient defence infrastructure, with priority given to dual-use infrastructure, including for strengthening military mobility in the EU and civil preparedness.

## **Priority 3:**

### **Improving Connectivity in Eastern Macedonia and Thrace**

**Budget - €65,545,512**

#### **Specific objective**

**3i** Developing a climate-resilient, smart, safe, sustainable, and intermodal TEN-T.

**Budget: €31,194,034**

**3ii** Developing and strengthening sustainable, climate-resilient, smart, and intermodal national, regional, and local mobility, with better access to the TEN-T and cross-border mobility.

**Budget: €34,351,478**

#### **Indicative Actions**

- Construction / upgrading of the comprehensive TEN-T road network.
- Interventions to improve road safety and citizen accessibility.

## **Priority 3A:**

# **Improving Security and Protection in Eastern Macedonia and Thrace**

**Budget - €23,000,000**

### **Specific objective**

**3Ai** Development of resilient defence infrastructure, with priority given to dual-use infrastructure, including for strengthening military mobility within the Union, as well as civil preparedness.

**Budget: €23,000,000**

### **Indicative Actions**

- Development / upgrading of border stations.
- Improvement of road network resilience to enhance mobility for military, civil, and security purposes.
- Procurement of equipment for emergency response.

### Strategic Program directions under PO4

- Ensuring quality facilities for all levels of education.
- Strengthening social welfare infrastructure and support structures for disadvantaged and vulnerable social groups.
- Strengthening the public health system through modern infrastructure for all.
- Supporting tourism, creating a new tourism identity, adopting the DMO process/mechanism, and strengthening the region's position on the international tourism map.
- Promoting cultural wealth and modern forms of culture, linked with local production, to enrich and upgrade the tourism product.

## **Priority 4A:**

### **Strengthening Social Cohesion**

**Budget: €64,702,958**

#### **Specific objective**

**4Ai.** Improving equal access to quality and inclusive education, training, and lifelong learning services through the development of accessible infrastructure, including strengthening the resilience of distance and online education and training.

**Budget: €35,000,000**

**4Aii.** Ensuring equal access to healthcare and strengthening the resilience of health systems, including primary healthcare, and promoting the transition from institutional care to family- and community-based care.

**Budget: €23,702,958**

**4Aiii.** Strengthening the role of culture and sustainable tourism in economic development, social inclusion, and social innovation.

**Budget: €6,000,000**

#### **Indicative Actions**

- Creation, expansion, and modernization of primary or secondary education facilities.
- Creation, expansion, and modernization of higher education institutions.
- Infrastructure and equipment in the health sector.
- Protection, promotion, and utilization of cultural infrastructure.
- Development of integrated accessible tourist destinations.
- Protection, promotion, and utilization of significant natural heritage sites and strengthening accessibility infrastructure for them.
- Protection and development of alternative tourism infrastructure and services.
- Actions to promote and highlight cultural heritage.
- Actions to promote tourism resources and thematic forms of tourism.

### Strategic Program directions under PO4

- Improving access to employment and promoting lifelong learning, upskilling, and specialization of human resources, primarily in entrepreneurial and digital skills and RIS3 sectors, especially for the long-term unemployed, young people, women, and other disadvantaged population groups, including Roma, migrants, people with disabilities, and people with low socioeconomic and educational status.
- Promoting equal access to education and training, especially for disadvantaged groups at all levels, and preventing early school leaving, with emphasis on childcare.
- Strengthening public health structures and services, including primary care, mental health, and addiction treatment, with emphasis on deinstitutionalization and long-term care.
- Supporting disadvantaged population groups through a complex network of structures and services to combat poverty, discrimination, and social exclusion and strengthen social cohesion.
- Addressing shortages of highly skilled labor in critical technologies in STEP sectors and aligning investments with new EU strategic priorities, particularly by adapting workers, businesses, and entrepreneurs to change, contributing to decarbonization, resilience of productive capacity, defence, and security.

**Budget: €163,328,870**

#### **Specific objective**

**4Bi.** Improving access to employment and activation measures for all jobseekers, especially young people through the Youth Guarantee, the long-term unemployed, disadvantaged groups in the labor market, and economically inactive people, as well as promoting self-employment and the social economy.

**Budget: €16,750,000**

#### **Indicative Actions**

- Creation of new jobs for unemployed people in businesses, primarily in RIS3 strategy sectors.
- Creation of new jobs for unemployed people in businesses in areas where integrated territorial strategies are applied.
- Creation of new jobs for unemployed people in businesses in STEP critical technologies and new EU strategic priorities, such as the defence industry and decarbonization.
- Counseling, training, certification, internships, and mentoring for unemployed people. Also included are relevant skills development actions for unemployed people, related to the development and production of critical technologies under the STEP initiative, as well as to the Union's new strategic priorities, including the defence industry and decarbonization.
- Strengthening self-employment through the establishment of businesses by unemployed people — New Self-Employed Professionals — primarily in sectors of the RIS3 strategy.
- Strengthening self-employment through the establishment of businesses by unemployed people — New Self-Employed Professionals — in areas where integrated territorial strategies are implemented, including SUD and ITI.

**4Bvi.** Strengthening equal and timely access to quality, sustainable, and affordable services, including services that promote access to housing and person-centered care services, including healthcare; modernizing social protection systems, including access to social protection, with particular emphasis on children and disadvantaged groups; and improving accessibility — including for persons with disabilities — as well as the effectiveness and resilience of healthcare systems and long-term care services. Budget: €100,286,318

- Awareness-raising actions and intercultural interaction initiatives.
- Integrated interventions to support the integration of Roma people into the labor market (e.g. counseling interventions, training programs, rent subsidies, including actions to combat digital exclusion).
- Support for Roma people to improve living conditions (through Relocation Site Management Teams and initiatives aimed at improving living conditions).

- Actions supporting integrated territorial development through Integrated Spatial Investment and Integrated Spatial Investment for Sustainable Urban Development.
- Integrated local action plans to address child poverty, aiming at personalized interventions across all policy areas (health, education, early childhood education and care, housing, and nutrition).

### **Indicative Actions**

#### **5 Sustainable Urban Development (SUD) initiatives: Kavala, Drama, Komotini, Xanthi, Alexandroupoli & Drama**

- Promotion of areas of historical, commercial, cultural, and tourism interest.
- Upgrading and modernizing landmark buildings (historic, listed, or non-listed) and making them available for public use.
- Reuse of abandoned or degraded municipal buildings. Examples include: Cultural centers, Covered arcades, Warehouses, Municipal baths, Swimming pools, Buildings of particular architectural significance such as military barracks and historic residences owned by municipalities.
- Creation, upgrading, modernization of municipal markets.
- Creation, upgrading, modernization of municipal sports & recreation areas, including specialized sports and "playgrounds".
- Development of visitor routes to tourism destinations.

- Construction, expansion, and upgrading of urban road networks to improve traffic conditions and public safety.
- Promotion of clean urban transport.
- Traffic management interventions (equipment and works).
- Environmental quality monitoring systems, including action plans addressing air pollution and noise.
- Natural risk prevention systems, including flood protection and stream management.
- Improving the energy efficiency of public buildings and shared public spaces.
- Introducing and expanding the use of mild/alternative energy sources in public buildings and communal spaces.
- Applying new technologies to improve public services and simplify communication between municipalities and citizens, including digital applications in tourism and culture.
- Support structures for entrepreneurs, professionals, and young people.
